

ROBINSON'S AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

Important Program Dates

- September 11th - The first day of after-school activities and late buses.
- May 23rd - The last day of after-school activities and late buses.
- The After-School Program will not meet on student holidays, early release days, or during inclement weather cancellations. In addition, there will be no after-school activities or buses on the following dates: October 6, November 20 and 21, December 15, January 12, February 16, and May 24.

Late Bus Information

- Late buses are provided on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.
- Late buses will depart at approximately 4:45 pm.
- Late bus runs differ from the morning and afternoon runs. There are fewer buses and stops. Your child's late bus information can be found in SIS ParentVUE.

After-School Specifics

- The After-School Program runs from 3:00 PM - 4:30 PM
 - Students are expected to report to club/activity or a teacher for support by 3:00 PM
 - Students are expected to make an appointment with a teacher if academic support is needed.
 - Transition to the cafeteria for late bus dismissal 4:30 - 4:45
 - Late bus dismissal / parent pick-up 4:45
- Parents should use the Kiss N Ride loop to pick up their students.
- If a student needs to leave an activity prior to dismissal, the parent should contact the activity sponsor, supervising teacher, or after-school program office so arrangements can be made for pick-up.
- There is no fee for the after-school program (some clubs may require a fee due to an activity registration cost).
- Students should sign up for clubs using the After-School sign-up form posted each late bus day on Schoology.
- Discuss your child's after-school plans every morning to prevent any confusion in the afternoon.
- Encourage your child to get involved in as many activities as possible. After-School is a great time to get extra academic help, make new friends, and meet new teachers.

Activity Schedule

- Program details and the quarterly activity list will be emailed via News You Choose weekly bulletin, The Ram blast and posted on grade level Schoology.
- Various clubs/activities will be added as the year progresses. Be sure to check back periodically for updates.
