



**Interested students must meet with an IB Coordinator starting in January of 10th grade to develop a 2-year plan!

✓ Prerequisites

- A class you must take to enroll in a more advanced course
- Class prerequisites are listed in the <u>Course Catalog</u>

- What career goals and postsecondary plans do you have?

- Considerations for taking an Honors class:

 - Greater emphasis on analysis
 - Analytical skill development
 - More reading and writing requirements

If there is a conflict in your schedule, the alternative course(s) will replace your first-choice elective(s).

Example:

- Studio Art 1
- Creative Writing 1
- Theater Arts 1



Counselors reserve the right to choose alternate courses if student does not provide 3

Additional Course Options

- 1. <u>FCPS Online Campus</u> course options (open to all grades)
 - You may take up to 2 FCPS online courses during the school year
- 2. <u>Self-Directed Online</u> Econ & Personal Finance (6120SD)
 - 8th course, fee required, summer options available, counselor approval required
 - Cost: \$140, Reduced: \$70, Free: \$14
 - Pass/Fail only
- 3. Academy options to consider primarily in your junior & senior year
 - <u>Fairfax Academy</u>
 - <u>Chantilly Academy</u>
 - <u>Falls Church Academy</u>
