

RSS offers the following International Baccalaureate courses as both Standard Level (SL) and Higher Level (HL) options, unless otherwise noted: Biology, Business Management, Chemistry, Design & Technology (SL only), Economics, English Literature, Environmental Systems (SL only), Film Studies, French, Geography (SL only), German, History of the Americas (HL only), Language & Literature, Latin, Math Analysis, Math Applications, Philosophy (SL only), Physics, Psychology, Social Anthropology, Spanish, Theatre Arts (HL only), Theory of Knowledge, Topics 20th Century (HL only), Visual Arts, World Religions (SL only)

RSS offers the following Advanced Placement courses: Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, US & Comparative Govt

DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES: Dual Enrollment classes, designated with a "DE" after their title on a student's transcript are taught by a high school teacher and offer college credit through a college or university.

HONORS COURSES: Honors classes are labeled with (HN) on the student's transcript. RSS offers the following Honors classes: Advanced Music and Theatre (3/4), Algebra 2, Biology, Economics and Personal Finance, English (9,10,11,12), Geometry, Geosystems, STEM Engineering, US VA Govt, US VA Hist, World Hist & Geog World, and Language (4,5) courses

The scores above represent the global, national, and state averages for public school students in the class of 2023. The FCPS score averages are reflective of an additional analysis that is inclusive of those students in the class of 2023 who were enrolled in June 2023.

Grading Policy Changes Affecting the 2020-21 School Year: To provide flexibility to students and ensure they were not penalized by the challenges of distance learning, FCPS made the following changes to the high school grading policy for the 2020-21 school year only. These changes were announced in March of 2021. They included:

- Use of No Mark (NM) instead of F grades for all courses. No credit was awarded, and the course was not factored into the student's grade point average (GPA).
- Student/families could choose a mark of "P" (pass) instead of passing letter grades as their final mark in up to two current high school courses. Students had the opportunity to choose this through fourth quarter. This flexibility is in addition to the allowances for designating courses as pass/fail at the beginning of the school year. Therefore, a student's transcript may include more marks of "P" than typically seen on an FCPS transcript.

Community:

Robinson Secondary School is a 7th-12th grade public school located in Fairfax County, Virginia, a residential suburb of Washington, DC. Robinson is a fully authorized International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme (DP) and Middle Years Programme (MYP) school.

Robinson opened in 1971 and is named in honor of Sergeant James W. Robinson, Jr. the first Virginia resident to receive the Medal of Honor for conspicuous gallantry and heroism in the Vietnam conflict. Sergeant Robinson provides a model for character and leadership that extends to all facets of our school program.

At the high school level, Robinson strives to prepare students to successfully meet the many challenges of a global society. We recognize that those challenges include technological, cultural, environmental, ethical, and societal issues that, in turn, demand strong technical and interpersonal skills. Consequently, our curriculum is diverse and includes a broad range of courses in the humanities, arts, and sciences with an emphasis on the use of technology across the curriculum.

FCPS is one of the largest school divisions in the nation with more than 182,000 students attending 199 schools and centers. FCPS students and their families come from nearly every country around the world and speak more than 200 different languages. 2023-24 school During the vear. 36.1 percent of approximately FCPS students identified themselves as White; 28.7 percent Hispanic; 18.7 percent Asian; 9.8 percent Black, and 6.3 percent identified as multi-racial or other.

More than 38,000 FCPS students are multilingual learners. Approximately 30,000 receive special education services. Nearly 54,000 FCPS students are eligible for the Federal Free and Reduced-Price Meal Program (FRM)

86.8% of FCPS 2023 graduates indicated their intention to attend post-secondary educational institutions. Of this group: 65.2% pursue 4yr colleges; 17.6% pursue 2yr college; 6.3% pursue military/ employment; 4% pursue other educational plans.

FCPS is located in Fairfax County, Virginia, the most populous jurisdiction in Virginia and the metropolitan Washington, DC area, with more than one million residents.

FCPS Curriculum:

The instructional program for FCPS is a comprehensive rigorous curriculum containing benchmarks outlined in the Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL).

Six high school academies offer technical and specialized courses not found at all high schools. Career and Technical Education (CTE), fine arts, and world languages courses are accessed by students from all high schools. CTE courses offer numerous credentialing opportunities for students who pass industry certification exams.

FCPS has additional requirements for the standard diploma beyond those of the Virginia Board of Education. Students must earn three credits in science in three different lab areas and three credits in social studies for an FCPS standard diploma.

Grading System:

Grade point average (GPA) is calculated on the basis of all high school courses for which credit has been earned, attempted, and previously awarded. High school courses taken in middle school may be expunged from the high school transcript. The parent or guardian must submit a request within nine weeks of his/her child entering an FCPS high school.

The FCPS grading scale was updated for the 2024-25 school year to introduce a Dmark. Prior to this, the grading scale used a D with a percent grade of 64-66 and an F with a percent grade of 50-63.

All Honors (HN) courses are weighted with an additional 0.5 quality points. Courses denoted as Advanced Placement (AP, Advanced (AV), Dual Enrollment (DE), or International Baccalaureate (IB) are weighted with an additional 1.0 quality points.
