	Frequently Asked Questions		
What are Blue days and Gold days?	Here at Robinson we run on a block schedule. Classes meet every-other-day. Odd courses are on Blue Days and even courses are on Gold Days. We highly encourage our students to do their homework on the day it is given. If they have difficulty, they can access a teacher to ask for help to support their learning and help with work before work is due.		
What is a subschool?	Each grade level is separated into a subschool. Each subschool has their own office with a subschool admin assistant and principal. These two people will follow their grade over the four years of high school and get to know the students as they grow and mature.		
How are counselors assigned?	Counselors are assigned according to a students' last name. Each counselor has an alpha range of students they work with. Counselors will stay with their students through the four years so they can get to know them and help them with their goals for the future.		
How does 4th period/Advisory /RAISE work?	RAISE is a time built into our school day to allow students to get extra help from teachers, finish work, make up quizzes/tests, and meet with other students for group projects. Students will pre-arrange to meet with a teacher during the RAISE session or will remain in the classroom of the 4th period assigned class.		
How do we learn about activities and sports?	The Robinson homepage is a hub for information. Links can be found for both athletic and clubs/activities information. In addition, students may stop in the Athletics and Activities Office. In addition, Robinson airs a news show called Good Morning Robinson (GMR). GMR serves as Robinson's announcements during Advisory.		



Who do I go to if I have a concern?	If you have a concern in regards to your child's progress in a class,we encourage you to contact the teacher of the class. We recommend you contact the teacher via email or phone as your first step of communication. If you would like to meet with the teacher, please contact that teacher to set up an appointment. If you are concerned about your child's progress as a whole, across classes, please contact the counselor to set up a parent/teacher conference with all of your child's teachers. Who do I call?	Counselors – social/emotional and academic concerns as well as questions in regards to graduation requirements and post-high school planning.
	Social Worker/Psychologist -social/emotional concerns. Our Social Worker and Psychologist serve as members of the special education team and participate in panels/group discussions for students who have been referred to local screening for greater academic concerns.
	Subschool Administrative Assistant -All attendance related concerns. Admin Assistants are a wealth of information and are often the first point of contact for questions you may have relating to our school.
	Grade Level Administrator -Grade level administrators oversee discipline and attendance for their grade level students. In addition, each administrator oversees subject areas/departments and is a point of contact for subject area concerns.
	College and Career Center Specialist —The Career Center Specialist has a variety of resources for post-high school planning including information related to colleges, careers, scholarships, summer programs, part-time jobs, financial aid, and volunteer opportunities. Resources are available in the Career Center for check-out and information sessions are held throughout the year to assist parents and students planning for the future.
